

World Book Day

The year groups have had a blast celebrating World Book Day, please see below what the year groups have been up to!

<u>F1-</u> To celebrate world book day, there have been lots of different story themed activities set up for the children to explore within the provision. We enjoyed a little catwalk to show off our cosy comfy clothes, or costumes. We all went to Y1 to share stories, and both the morning and all-day children enjoyed a cup of hot chocolate with a story before they go home.

As part of our Epic, the children walked to the outdoor learning area to listen to our current focus story 'Come On, Daisy'., we all enjoyed looking at the pond area and discussed the environment that Daisy the duckling might live in.

To finish off our communication week activities, F1 and F2 went to the hall together, to swap stories and books and will also sing our early years anthem 'Power in Me'.



<u>F2-</u> In F2 we have enriched our provision, celebrating different authors, genres and traditional tales. We have also planned a 'Book Surprise' for the children; the children had the opportunity to chose a book to be read to by a surprise teacher! We are extending our library session, to allow children to explore both fiction and non-fiction books. We linked with Y2 to buddy up and read to one another, sharing our story books that we brought in from home or one that we loved to read in school. F2 have shown some wonderful dancing skills as they learned a World Book Day dance routine with Dance Dayz drama workshop, we were so impressed with their moves and their listening skills! Well done, F2! You made us so proud!

<u>Y1-</u> Y1 enjoyed buddying up with F1 and F2 to read stories with them. The children loved dancing with Dance Dayz drama workshop! Well done Year 1!















<u>Y2-</u> Year 2 loved dancing with Dance Dayz drama workshop to learn a routine from the popular book and film adaption 'Matilda'. Their routines were amazing and all children took on the role of Matilda perfectly.

We discussed different book genres and explored the world of comic books in a little more detail. Children had the opportunity to look through classic comic strip magazines and then create their own comic strip based on a character and setting of their choice.

We designed and created our own book marks to use when reading our school library and home reading books.

We linked with F2 to buddy up and read to one another, sharing our story books that we brought in from home or one that we loved to read in school.

We then ventured on an outdoor book hunt to link with our outdoor learning. Children were given clues they needed to crack and follow the trail to find the hidden books. When they found the book, they discussed what genre of book they found and what they already knew about this book.

Children had the opportunity to share what they came dressed up in or what book they brought into school. The enjoyment on all the children's faces when they spoke passionately about the books they loved to read, was a real pleasure to see!
