Sunscreen Reminder

Children are encouraged to apply a long-lasting sunscreen protection before coming to school each day. If you are concerned your child may need to reapply during the day you can provide your own **named bottle** of either **roll-on** or **spray** sun protection, not cream. These are the easiest versions for our young children to apply by themselves as staff cannot apply sun screen for the children. These named bottles will be kept in a central place in the classroom for access during the day when directed by the staff. **Sun Creams/Lotions** should not be sent to school, as they are more difficult for children to apply themselves.

Please support your child in learning how to apply the sun screen independently at home so they are confident to do this in school as well as talk to them about when they might need to re-apply, before play and lunchtimes. Staff will supervise the application of sun screen to help children cover all exposed areas of skin but cannot do this for them. As such, children must learn to apply protection effectively to reduce the chance of burning.

A long-lasting sunscreen of Factor 30 or above is encouraged. We ask that you let us know if your child is allergic to any specific sun screen so we can safely manage application of products on children around your child.

Warm Weather Reminders

We hope the glorious warm weather stays, so therefore please could we remind parents to ensure their child brings into school a named hat and

The car erratically sped past the lollipop person, who was helping a group of children to cross the road.
